

How to get from Pisac:

To Cusco:

45 minutes, 28 km on a two-way, paved road with spectacular views of the Andes and Sacred Valley, be prepared for windy curves.

By taxi: Pisac Inn can arrange a taxi service that is safe, reliable, friendly and flexible. We recommend this for greater comfort and a more personalized experience; you can take your time to admire the scenery and stop to take photos. Make arrangements at the front desk at Pisac Inn, or ahead of time to assure availability. Please [contact us](#) for fares.

You can get a taxi on your own at the official taxi cooperative office, which is located just in front of the bridge on Avenida Amazonas where you are guaranteed a clean car in decent condition with a registered driver. Fares to Cusco cost between S/.50 – S/.60 (Approx. US\$17.85 – US\$21.50).

There is a new shared car service that has recently started operation just in front of the bridge on Avenida Amazonas for S/.5 per person. (Approx. US\$1.80.) There is no schedule; cars depart once they have 4 passengers. There is no guarantee of the vehicles condition or if they are registered.

By colectivo: Other than a taxi this is one of the quickest and most comfortable ways of getting from Pisac to Cusco. These mini-buses or colectivos are in decent condition and go directly to Cusco with no stops along the way. Fares S/.4 (Approx. US\$1.50.)

By bus: We do not recommend this option because buses are not in good condition, are overcrowded, and make constant stops so it takes much longer to get to Cusco. If you want this kind of local experience, you can take any of the buses that stop on the Avenida Amazonas, the main road that runs through Pisac just outside the [Chaska Pisac Hotel](#) to the bus terminal in Cusco. Fares approx. S/.3.50 (Approx. US\$1.25)

To Urubamba:

45 minutes, 39.8km on a two-way, paved road. This is a flat road that winds through the bottom of the Sacred Valley of the Incas with great views of the surrounding mountains and small towns.

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By bus: Urubamba is just one hour from Písaq so if you want to experience how the locals travel catch the Clorinda de Matto or Richary bus at the corner of the hospital on Avenida Amazonas. Fares cost S./2.50 (Approx. US\$1)

To Ollantaytambo:

60 minutes, 58.6km on a two-way, paved road. This is a flat road that winds through the bottom of the Sacred Valley of the Incas with great views of the surrounding mountains and small towns.

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You can get a taxi on your own at the official taxi cooperative office, which is located just in front of the bridge on Avenida Amazonas where you are guaranteed a clean car in decent condition with a registered driver. Fares around S/.80 (Approx. US\$29).

By bus: Take the bus to Urubamba at the corner of the hospital on Avenida Amazonas. (See instructions above) Fares cost S./2.50 (Approx. US\$1). When you arrive in the bus terminal in Urubamba cross to the other side of the terminal and take a colectivo to Ollantaytambo. Fares cost approx. S./1.50 (Approx. US\$0.60) and it takes approximately 30 minutes.
